- Offering Convenient, Same-day Colonoscopy Prep
- Reduces the need for lengthy prep, time off from work
- Colonoscopy success linked closely to pre-procedure bowel prep

HyGieaCare, Inc., today announced that a new HyGieaCare Center, where patients can experience simple and easy bowel prep on the same day as their scheduled colonoscopy, is to be opened at Harbor Shores Medical Center II, 4001 E. Baseline Road, in Gilbert, AZ in collaboration with Arizona Center for Digestive Health (AZCDH).

The Center features the HyGieaCare[®] Prep System, cleared by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to effectively clean the bowel using a gentle infusion of warm, gravity-flow filtered water. The use of this proprietary method means patients can forgo many of the elements that make traditional bowel prep inconvenient and uncomfortable.

“Colonoscopy saves lives. Colon prep is one off the biggest barriers to this life-saving test,” said Virender K. Sharma, MD FASGE FACG AGAF who practices gastroenterology at AZCDH. “We are very excited that the first HyGieaCare Center in Arizona is opening in Gilbert and we will have the ability to offer same-day HyGieaCare prep to our patients.”

Good bowel cleansing is the key to a successful colonoscopy, early cancer prevention.

Colorectal cancer is the second leading cause of death from cancer in the United States¹. It typically begins as abnormal growths called polyps, which can be detected and removed during a colonoscopy, dramatically lowering the risk of death from the disease by more than half². Unfortunately, up to one-quarter of all colonoscopies are reported to have inadequate bowel preparation, which can hinder these efforts³.

The reasons for inadequate prep varies and is not insignificant(25-30%), including poor compliance with preparation instructions; having a medical condition, like diabetes, that makes

drinking large quantities of water difficult; and physical impairments that can prevent a person from getting to a bathroom quickly. A bowel that is not adequately cleansed can result in a missed polyp or cancer, a longer procedure time, and a repeat colonoscopy at much shorter intervals than if adequate cleansing. The implications of an earlier repeat colonoscopy have clear impact for costs, inconvenience and risks.

“Following the successful opening of our Center in Austin TX, we are continuing to expand as HyGIeaCare Centers are being built at Dallas TX, Norfolk VA and now in Gilbert AZ,” said Gavriel Meron, Chairman and CEO of HyGIeaCare, Inc. “Patients will be able to benefit from comfortable same day prep.”

The convenience of simple, same-day prep.

At the HyGIeaCare Center, the prep is performed in a clean and comfortable environment. A trained prep-tech will lead the patient to a private room where he or she will be seated on a comfortable lounge table. The prep-tech will walk the patient through the procedure, which routinely takes less than one hour. As such, the patient does not have to get up early to take any colon cleansing solutions prior to the colonoscopy. A small, sterile, disposable nozzle is easily inserted into the rectum and a gentle and comfortable stream of warm water flows into the bowel, loosening stool and causing the intestine to contract allowing for the comfortable and discreet evacuation of the colon. Water will continue to gently flow until the prep-tech determines the colon has been sufficiently cleansed.

The HyGIeaCare Prep replaces traditional prep for colonoscopy and is performed on the same day as the colonoscopy, prior to the scheduled procedure. Patients who have experienced this prep have reported that it is simple, comfortable and convenient.
